Death/Serious Injury (Drowning)	<ul> <li>Inadequate instruction</li> <li>Equipment failure</li> <li>Poor supervision</li> <li>Failure to follow instruction re: procedures and boundaries</li> <li>Participants unable to swim, i.e. failure to disclose swimming ability</li> <li>Extreme environmental event         (Flooding, Earthquakes, Lightning &amp; High Winds)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Instructors are suitably qualified</li> <li>Regular inspections</li> <li>Clear instructions are given</li> <li>Group Leaders to spread along river bank</li> <li>Listen attentively and follow instructions</li> <li>A buoyancy aid must be worn when on the river regardless of swimming ability</li> <li>Move to emergency meeting area</li> </ul>	TSCC Group Leaders Group Leaders + Participants TS instructor	Before Monthly inspection Beginning & During Beginning & During In the event	Suspected major injury  - All to vacate area  - Group leader to coordinate first aid  - Group leader to arrange for ambulance or extra assistance  - Inform host of incident immediately and fill out appropriate forms  - Assess if activity can continue  Entrapment  - Group leader to pull participant out of river  Other/ Minor Injury  - Group leader to administer first aid
Entrapment	<ul><li>Standing up in current</li><li>Kayak getting stuck in vegetation/ logs</li><li>Capsizing kayak</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Brief all adults during orientation on how to manage kayaking safely</li> <li>Have a 1:5 ratio (1 adult: 5 students)</li> <li>Use throw bag to pull Participants out</li> </ul>	TS instructor  Participants + Group leaders	Before During	
Loss of Equipment	<ul> <li>Gear floating down stream</li> <li>Lifejackets getting left out and blown away</li> <li>Stream rising/sweeping away boats</li> </ul>	<ul><li>- Have sufficient supervision</li><li>- Put Lifejackets away between sessions</li><li>- Pack up and lock kayaks at the end of the day</li></ul>	Participants + Group leaders  TS instructor	During After After	
Exposure to Elements (Sun, wind, temperature)	- Long periods out in the sun or wind and rain without correct clothes	<ul> <li>Move to an indoor Activity during "bad weather"</li> <li>Allow time for changing prior to and after rotation</li> <li>Ensure the group has adequate clothing</li> </ul>	TS instructor  Participants + Group leaders	Before & During	
Psychological Harm	<ul><li>Being bullied or forced to participate</li><li>Fear of deep/moving water</li></ul>	- Challenge by choice - Group encouragement	TS instructor Participants + Group leaders	During
